- i. The family tree is chronological, bottom to top.
 - ii. Antonio Maria Peralta's line of descent is shown in red.
 - iii. Individuals known to have died in infancy are in *italics*.
 - iv. Living descendants' names are not shown without consent.
 - v. Due to space limitations, this chart shows only Antonio's line past the first generation of the four brothers who owned Rancho San Antonio.
 - vi. The many descendants of Antonio Peralta's siblings not associated with Rancho San Antonio are not shown.

- Crisanto Antonio Peralta
b. 1795, Mission Santa Clara. Died in childhood.
- Maria Trinidad Peralta
b. 1798, Mission Santa Clara, d. 1875, San Jose, m. Mariano de la Cruz Garcia, 1820.
- Maria Josefa Peralta
b. 1798, Mission Santa Clara, d. 1852.
Never married, lived with father in San Jose. She adopted her father's servant, Maria Dolores, nicknamed Chajita, and killed her the San Jose adobe when she died.
- Maria Guadalupe Peralta
b. 1797, San Jose, d. 1896.
Never married, lived with father in San Jose.
- Maria Luisa Fermina Peralta
b. 1803, in San Jose, d. 1801.
- José Maria Serafino Peralta
b. 1803, Mission Del Norte, d. 1803.
- Maria Luisa Fermina Barbara Peralta
b. 1804, Mission Del Norte, d. 1805.
- José Francisco Antonio Peralta
b. 1807, Mission Del Norte, d. 1811, Santa Clara.
- José Vicente Peralta
b. 1808, Santa Clara, d. 1810, Santa Clara.
- Maria Luisa
b. 1810, Santa Clara, d. 1810, Santa Clara.
m. Mariano de la Cruz Garcia, 1801, Santa Clara.
They left California for South America in 1805. Maria is believed to have died December 15, 1873, buried at Mission Santa Clara.
- José Ramon and Maria Ramona Peralta, twins
b. 1811, d. 1811, Santa Clara.
